Sample – Chapter 1: THE AUTONOMOUS MECHANISM

The dominant economic system was not designed. No one sat at a table to draft its blueprints or define its ethical principles. Its appearance was, instead, the consequence of millions of individual actions, each pursuing a particular interest, but all aligned by one single operating principle: the pursuit of profit. It spread across the world not because it was the best that existed, but because it was functionally effective. It produced results, generated material wealth, and offered the tangible sensation of immediate progress.

From its initial configuration, the mechanism has operated without

incorporating emotional variables. Its functioning is cold and practical. The impulse that activates and perpetuates it is not a mandate of justice nor a pursuit of collective well-being, but the competition for resources and control of markets. Once this economic system was set in motion, it did not stop. Its evolution has not consisted in changing its purpose, but in perfecting its methods to ensure its own continuity, learning to camouflage its primary function under narratives of freedom, innovation, and opportunity.
