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THE ILLUSION OF DISCONTINUITY

This book argues that this boundary is semantic, not physical. At the atomic level, the distinction between “alive” and “inert” dissolves; all that exists are rearrangements of energy and matter.

Through strict logic, the fear of “nothingness” is dismantled: if matter is never created or destroyed, mortality is merely a perceptual bias. We are not

temporary beings that end—we are transitional variations of an eternal process.

Sample – Chapter 1: NOTHING WAS NEVER AN OPTION

The human mind, in its search for meaning, often asks a question that seems the deepest of all: why is there something instead of nothing? This question has been the starting point of countless philosophical, religious, and scientific systems. It is presented as the fundamental mystery. However, all its apparent depth rests on a flawed premise. The question is not wrong because it is difficult to answer, but because it is wrongly posed from its origin. It assumes that “nothing” is a real alternative, a possible state that, for some reason, did not happen.

But let us stop to examine what “nothing” really is. It is not a place, nor a state, nor a void. It is, strictly speaking, a concept we use to point to the absence of things. When we say “there is nothing in the box,” we mean that it is empty of objects. The concept works in our everyday language, but it fails completely when we try to elevate it to a cosmic category. For nothing to “be” the original state of reality, it would have to have the property of being, and at the very instant it is, it ceases to be nothing and becomes something.
